## **Other Descriptive Information**

The Bache Family collection contains a range of letters from members of the extended Franklin-Bache family, descendants of Benjamin Franklin. Although the vast majority are from the early republic, there are some papers from the twentieth century that involve Franklin's legacy (the collection appears to have been acquired by the APS in 1938). Among the correspondence included are letters to and from Benjamin Franklin Bache, William Temple Franklin, Sarah Franklin Bache, Richard Bache, William Bache and Catherine Wistar Bache.

The papers reflect miscellaneous correspondence to and from this very prominent and important American family. Many of the letters are personal in nature and involve correspondence amongst members of the extended family about their lives. There are other significant collections of such correspondence in the papers of William Temple Franklin, Sarah Franklin Bache, and Benjamin Bache Franklin at the APS. Nonetheless, this miscellaneous collection does provide a portrait of family relations in the early national period for both those within the extended Bache family and for those writing to the Bache's about their own family affairs. The collection has a notable number of women letter writers who often relate their daily life and family affairs.

A letter from Richard, one of the Benjamin Franklin Bache's sons, to his mother Sarah captures the intimacy of many of these letters. The long letter recounts a game the children played with the children of family friends. The game involved sticking needles into a burning candlestick at midnight to find out who one's future spouse would be. When the children did it, one of the older children came into the room wearing a sheet to look like a ghost and frightened the younger children. Among the more interesting items is a letter from William Franklin to his sister Sarah Franklin Bache in 1794. Although Benjamin Franklin disowned his son, the two siblings kept in contact, as evidenced by this correspondence. The collection also contains a significant portion of correspondence from the 1830s and 1840s from less prominent members of the Bache family writing about their lives.

There are scattered documents from the late-nineteenth century and early twentieth century. Of particular note are a series of letters discussing the family's attempt to take control of Benjamin Franklin's Trust that he had left to Boston and Philadelphia for charity. Around 1890, some of Franklin descendants tried to reclaim approximately \$450,000 Franklin left to charity, and these documents consist of the family's organizing efforts and legal strategies. The collection also contains the wills of Richard and Benjamin Franklin Bache and two genealogical collections from the 1870s that trace out the descendants of Sarah Franklin Bache.

A note on the correspondents: Richard Bache, an immigrant from England who had worked as a merchant in New York and then Philadelphia, married Franklin's daughter Sarah (Sally). Benjamin Franklin was at first displeased with the marriage, but eventually accepted it. The Bache's had a number of children. Benjamin Franklin Bache, their first child, became a favorite of Franklin's, and he traveled to Europe with Franklin during the American Revolution.

Richard Bache served in a number of prominent organizations during his time in Philadelphia, including postmaster general during the American Revolution. He went into business with the Shippens and Willings, served on Revolutionary committees, and was a Director at the Bank of North America.

Sarah Franklin Bache, called Sally, was a politically active Philadelphian who supported the American Revolution by serving in voluntary associations and later supported the Democratic-Republicans, advising her son Benjamin Franklin Bache on political matters. She was also a close confidante of her father. The family lived with him and assisted him in his old age. The Bache's had eight children, among them Benjamin Franklin Bache and William Bache (a doctor who married Catherine Wistar), all of whom have letters in this collection.

William Temple Franklin was the illegitimate son of Franklin's illegitimate – and eventually disowned – son, William Franklin. William Temple, like Benjamin Franklin Bache, traveled to France with his grandfather. William, however, played a far more important role while there. While Benjamin Franklin Bache was just a child at the time, William Temple served as Franklin's aide and was eventually appointed Secretary to the America delegation at the Treaty of Versailles. He later published Franklin's papers, which were given to him as part of his inheritance.
